- JERELEAN KURTZ TALLEY IS THE OLDEST LIVING (VERIFIED) PERSON AND LIVES IN MICHIGAN. BORN MAY 23, 1899, SHE IS 115 YEARS OLD.

**In 1965, at age 90 and with no heirs, Jeanne Calment signed a deal to sell her apartment to lawyer André-François Raffray, on a contingency contract. Raffray, then aged 47 years, gareed to pay her a monthly sum of 2,500 francs until she died. Raffray ended up paying Calment the equivalent of more than \$180,000, which was more than double the apartment's value. After Raffray's death from cancer at the age of 77, in 1995, his widow continued the payments until Calment's death at age 122!
