	The majority of religions teach that we are saved by our works. These are "legalists".
	The others believe that we are saved by grace.
2)	Am I a legalist if I believe that I have to do something to be saved?Yes orNo Ephesians 2:8-10
3)	Who are the legalists? Those who believe that we are saved by: grace plus works, grace plus faith, grace through faith?  Ephesians 2:8-10
4)	Am I a legalist if I believe that I am saved by Christ's work in me?Yes orNo See Colossians 1:27; Ephesians 2:8-10
5)	In the parable of the vine and the branch found in <b>John 15:1-8</b> , what saves the branch? Abiding in the vine, orBearing fruit
6)	If bearing fruit is not what saves us, why bother? John 15:8
7)	If we are not saved by our works, why is it that we are judged by our works?  1 Peter1:17
	Fruit-bearing does not save the branch, but it is a demonstration that the branch is abiding in the vine. It is the connection that is judged.
8)	James 2:17-20 says that faith without works is dead.
9)	<b>Romans 3:20</b> says that we are not justified or made right by the works of the law, but the law gives us a knowledge of sin.
10)	The law is a mirror that shows us our true condition of sin (James 1:22-25). Now that we see the dirt of our sin we are drawn to Jesus. Galatians 3:24 says that the law is our schoolmaster to lead us to Christ who is now able to cleanse us of our sin and save us.
